Regulation of membership fees of Montessori Europe*

**The original legal version is in German as the domicile is in Switzerland, Lucerne. This version includes the fees decided on in Bad Honnef, January 18th, 2003 at the act of foundation of ME.*

1. Membership Fees and other sources of financing

- 1.1 The Membership fees are the main source of finances of Montessori Europe. They shall relate to the financial situation of the members and can alter in the amount as long as differences in purchasing power exist among the countries in Europe.
- 1.2 Besides 1.1 the organization shall be financed by Sponsors and public financial contributions. The organization can also offer services for charge to keep the performance costs low.
- 1.3 The fees can relate to the purchasing power of the member countries. The fees shall be as low as possible to promote the growth of a powerful organization.

2. Membership Fees and Reductions (Discounts)

- 2.1 General membership fees

- 2.2 Members from the countries belonging to the group „centre“ and the group „east“, according Appendix „list of countries“, can assert a reduction of 50%.
- 2.3 The Executive Committee can decide on a further reduction for members from the countries belonging to the group „east“ (appendix list of countries) The Executive Committee decides on which country belongs to which group of the „list of countries“.
